



## MOUNTING SUGGESTIONS:

**Honda VT1300C  
Sabre/Stateline/Interstate  
2010-2017 - One-piece Seat**

<b>Hardware:</b>	Stock fender Allen screw
<b>Tools needed:</b>	Phillips screwdriver Metric Allen wrenches

### Removal of Stock Seat:

1. Remove the side covers from each side of the motorcycle. These are friction-fit; pull them off the frame starting at the bottom of the covers.



2. Locate and remove the two Allen screws that hold the front of the seat in place. There is one on each side of the frame.

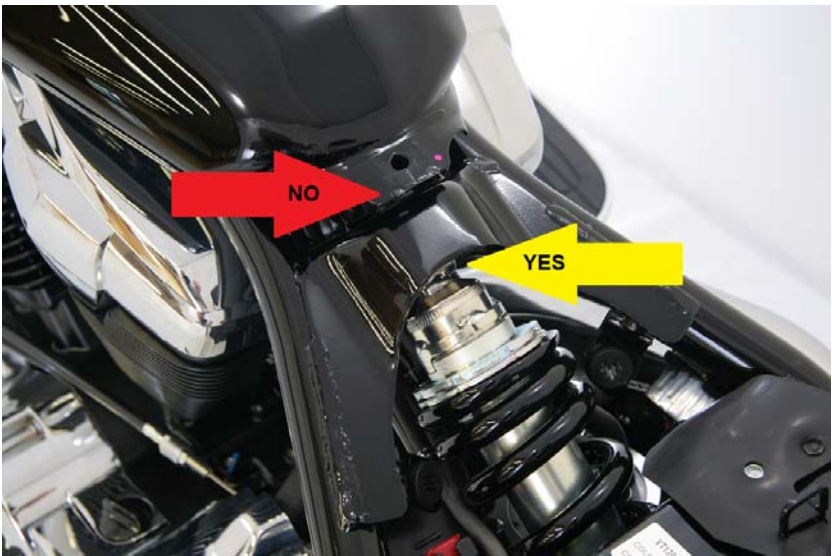


3. Locate and remove the rear Allen screw mounting the seat to the fender. It is hidden under the seat cover. This screw will be used to mount your Mustang seat.

4. Lift the rear of the seat up, and pull the seat back and off the motorcycle.

### Installation of Mustang Seat:

1. Slide the Mustang seat's front bracket into the opening behind the gas tank, just above the shock mount. Do **not** mount the seat under the lip of the tank.



2. Push the seat forward until the rear bracket aligns with the fender mount.

3. Use the stock Allen screw to secure the seat's rear bracket to the fender.
